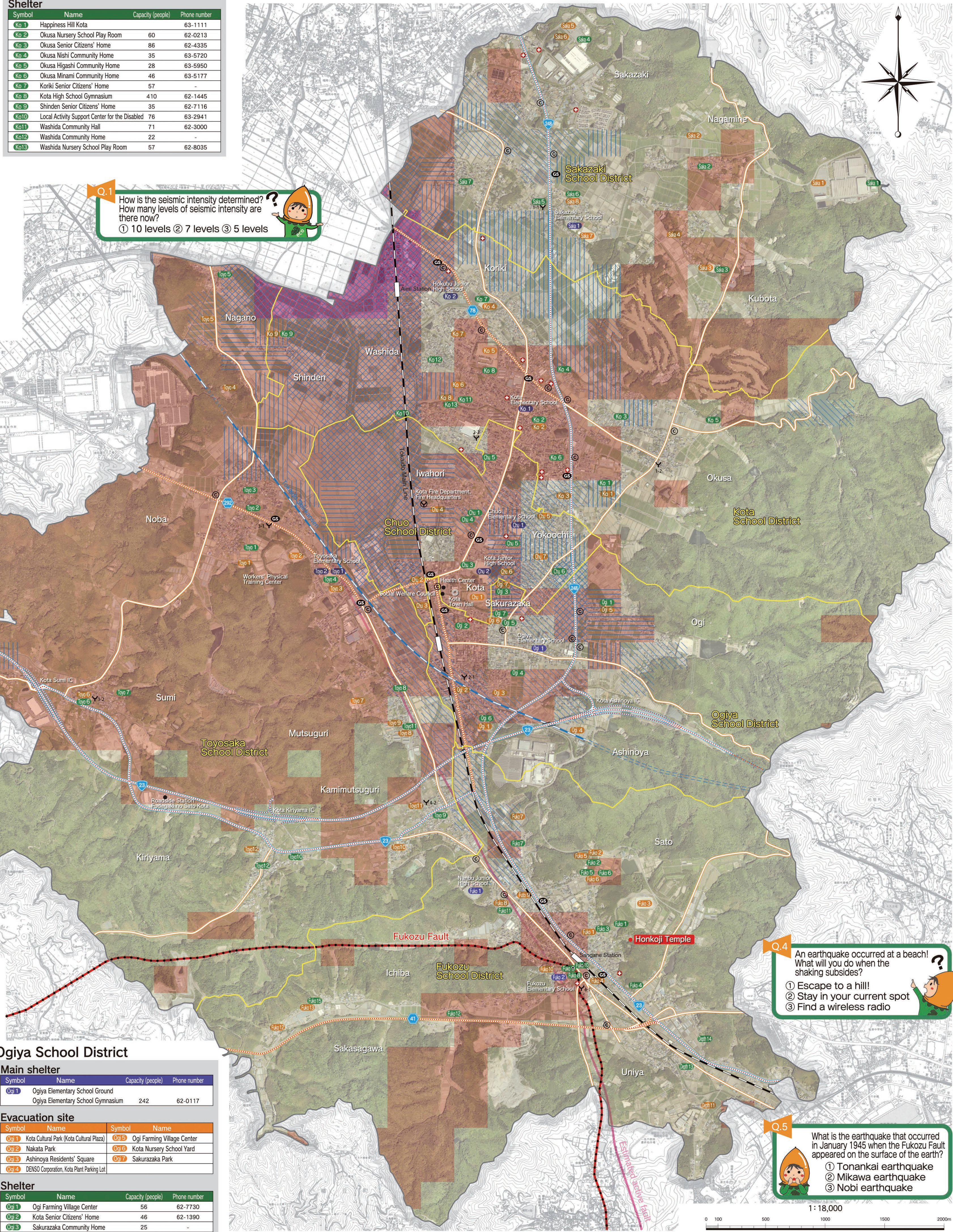
Fukozu Fault

On January 13, 1945, the Mikawa earthquake (magnitude 6.8) with an epicenter off the coast of Nishura, Gamagori City occurred. The earthquake fault, a natural monument designated by Aichi Prefecture, was created at that time. A monument and a pillar showing the displacement of the ground surface due to the earthquake have been built.



Honkoji Temple

The official name of Honkoji Temple is Soto Sect Zuiunzan Honkoji. Founded by the MATSUDAIRA Tadasada, first head of the Fukozu MATSUDAIRA family (one of the eighteen Mikawa MATSUDAIRA). Kishoein Daisho (great preceptor) was the first chief priest of the temple. The principal image is a Buddha called Shakanyorai, and the flanking images are Jizo Bosatsu (Jizo Bodhisattva) and Senju Kannon Bosatsu (Thousand-Armed Kannon Buddhist deity for life extension and easy birth). It is also called Migawari (sacrificial) Kannon, and was built in 1528 as a prayer place and a family cemetery for the Fukozu MATSUDAIRA family until now. The *Tsukiji-bei* (a wall made of rammed earth) that collapsed due to the Mikawa earthquake still remains at the *Higashi-gobyosho* (eastern stone mausoleum).

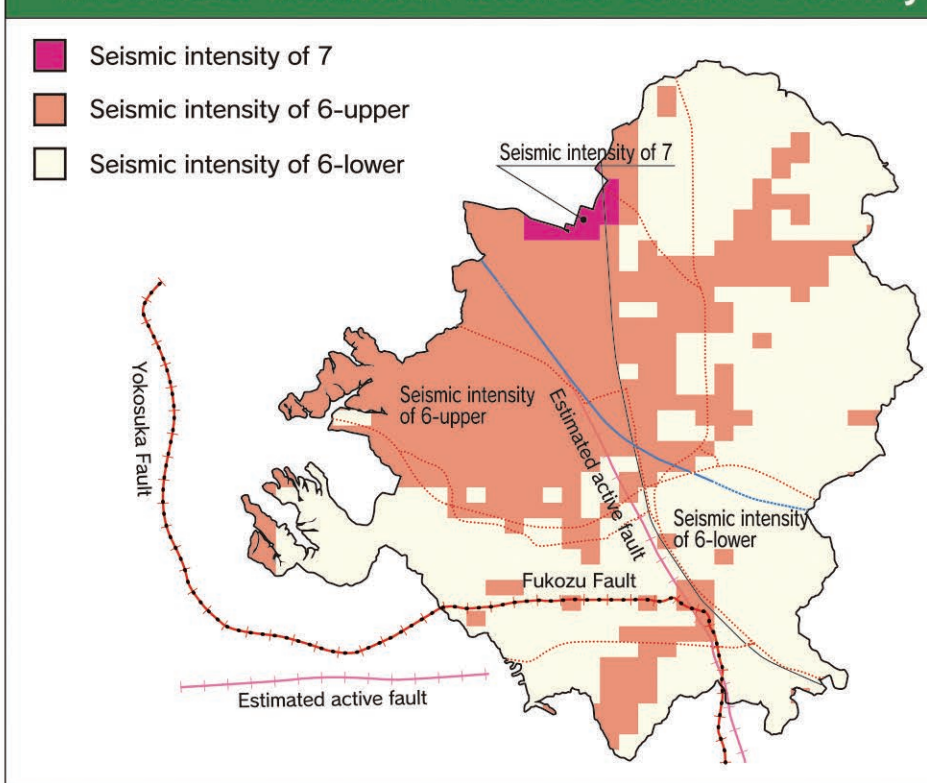

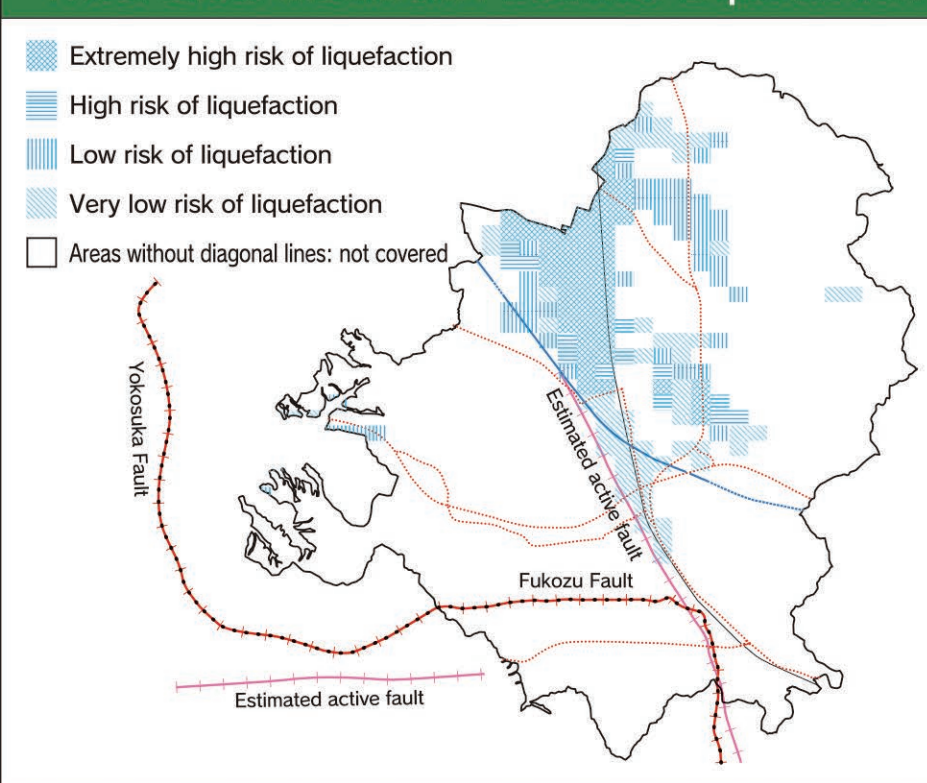
